Apprenticing to be an AKC Hunt Test Judge

As many of you already know the AKC has made a few changes to judging Hunt Tests. These changes are many however; the one I want to address is the apprenticeship program. The rules for apprenticing are quite simple...there are no real rules! As a club member you simply need to contact any member of the Hunt Test committee, preferably the secretary since she or he is the one that will be setting the schedule and dealing with the logistics. Let them know what level you wish to apprentice judge. At that point your name is submitted and you can be scheduled to apprentice at the upcoming Hunt Test, pending the approval of the judges you will be apprenticing under. When contacting the secretary of the Hunt Test think of yourself as you would the dogs, get your information to her or him before the closing date so your name can be correctly inserted into the catalog as an apprentice. If you have your AKC judge's number that you obtained after attending the judging seminar the secretary will be most appreciative.

Remember it is your responsibility to approach the Hunt Test committee, not the responsibility of the club to contact you. Anyone desiring to apprentice is required to follow the steps above. If for some reason there becomes a large group of people desiring to apprentice, the Hunt Test Committee will have to handle the situation as they see fit. There can be only as many apprentices in the field as there are fields available with judges, i.e. one field of two judges can have one apprentice.

The AKC Hunt Test world is growing by leaps and bounds hence in need of good, fair and pleasant judges wanting to judge for the right reasons. MHSAs encourages the apprentice program and promotes these desired traits; so get out there and apprentice!

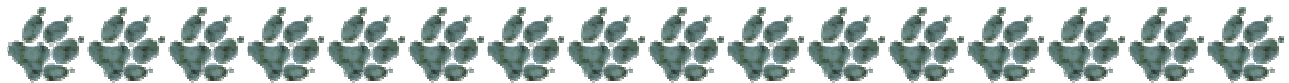

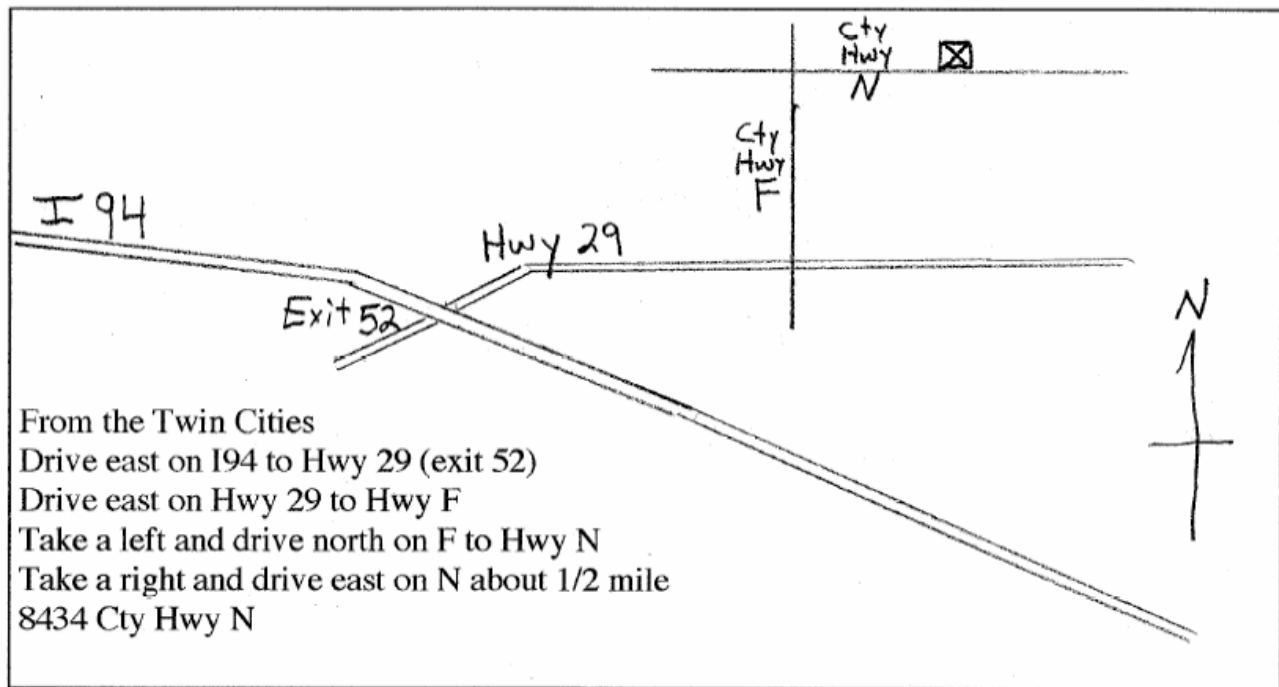

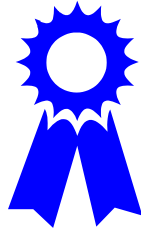

Plans for the 2007 fun trials are now underway. Please be patient as planning is currently being determined by the availability of birds.

Our first fun trial for 2007 will be held on **June 23, 2007** at Major Ave. Hunt Club following the MHSA Working Dog Test. Cost will be \$15.00 per entry.

The stakes we are planning to offer include:

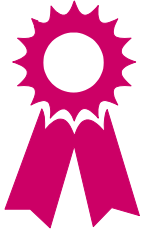
- Puppy: Any handler. Dog must be 15 months or younger at the start of the first fun trial; dog may be steady or un-steady.
- Junior Handler: Any dog, any handler under 16 years of age. Dog may be steady or un-steady.
- Derby: Any dog, any handler. Dog must be less than 2 years old, dog must be steady.
- Novice: Neither dog nor handler may have placed in any stake in AKC Licensed Field Trial. Dog may be steady or un-steady.
- Open: Any Dog, any handler. Dog must be steady.
- Hunting Dog: Handler shoots, dog may be unsteady. Score is based 50% on shooting/50% on dog work.
- Shooting Dog: Handler shoots, dog must be steady. Score is based 50% on shooting/50% on dog work

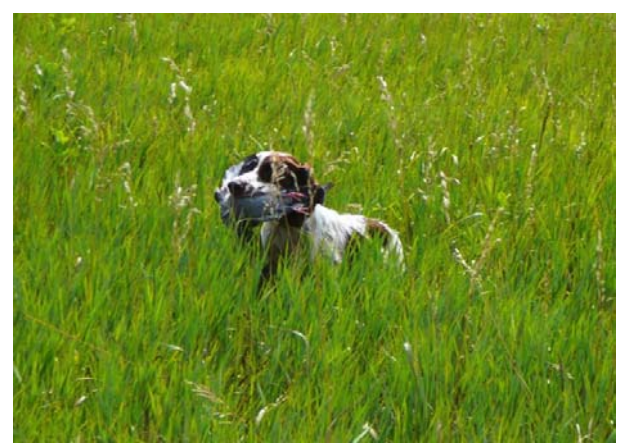

Pheasant 'coq-au-vin'

Ingredients for preparing the pheasant:

8 T olive oil
 2 banana shallots, peeled and sliced
 4 garlic cloves, peeled and chopped
 16 pheasant thighs
 14 fl oz red wine
 14 fl oz beef stock

Ingredients for preparing the Cavalo nero:

4 T butter
 4 T olive oil
 4 handfuls of chopped cavalo nero (black-leaf kale)

Method :

1. Heat the oil in a large pan. Add the shallot and garlic and sauté for 1-2 minutes to soften.
2. Add the pheasant thighs to the pan and continue to sauté for 8-10 minutes, until the pheasant is crispy, golden and thoroughly cooked.
3. Add the wine and stock and bring to the boil. Reduce the heat and simmer gently for a further 8-10 minutes, until the sauce has reduced.
4. Meanwhile, heat the additional oil and butter in a separate pan. Add the cavalo nero and sauté for a few minutes.
5. To serve, transfer the pheasant and sauce to a warm dish and spoon the cavalo nero alongside. Serves 4.
